Safeguarding spotlight on: Child on child abuse



Child on child abuse or harm is any form of physical, sexual, emotional and financial abuse, and coercive control, exercised between children, and within children's relationships. This can include:

- bullying, including cyberbullying, prejudice-based and discriminatory bullying
- physical abuse such as hitting, kicking, shaking, biting, hair pulling, or otherwise causing physical harm; this may include an online element which facilitates, threatens and/or encourages physical abuse
- Harmful sexual behaviours or sexual harassment, such as sexual comments, remarks, jokes and online sexual harassment, which may be standalone or part of a broader pattern of abuse
- causing someone to engage in sexual activity without consent, consensual and non-consensual sharing of nude and semi nude images and or videos.

Downplaying certain behaviours, for example dismissing sexual harassment as "just banter", "just having a laugh", "part of growing up" or "boys being boys"; or not recognising that emotional bullying can sometimes be more damaging than physical harm and should be taken equally seriously, can lead to a culture of unacceptable behaviours and an unsafe environment for children therefore any form of child on child abuse is taken very seriously at Colburn Community Primary School.

If you have any concerns about peer on peer harm or abuse, please speak to a member of the safeguarding team.
