Safeguarding spotlight: Advice about JusTalk Kids



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JUSTALKKIDS

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? JusTalk Kids is a child's version of the JusTalk app – a highly popular social networking platform – designed for users up to 13 years of age, allowing them to video call, message and participate in group chats. While adults can link their own JusTalk account to their child's and make use of parental controls, it's important to understand the risks associated with the app.

SUBSCRIPTION FOR PREMIUM ACCESS

White Justolk Rids is free, there's the option to subscribe to a kids' premium account or o premium lamily account. At a cost, this feature allows children to have occess to more fun features such as games they can play with others in a call exclusive stickers; a badge denoting them as a premium subscriber; and

RESISTANCE TO CONTROLS

Just alk Kids endeavours to allow children the sense of having a chat-based app white allowing parents to set controls (within the app or from their ewo adult Just alk account). The basis behind this is positive, however, some children are challenging their parents by refunding to use Just alk Kids, preferring to use the adult version without any restrictions in place.

KNOWING THE PARENT

After describeding Justicia kole, parents can set o passcole which users must enter to additional contacts. The parental controls help to monage which content can be viewed and who children can add as a contact this then allows children to chall with friends in a controlled emirronment, however, prospective contexts don't have to know a specific username. In theory, someone could type in a random name and then add them as a friend.

POTENTIAL DATA LEAKS

sustant and Justinit Kids count to be secure and encrypted, going so for as to state that even the developers themselves won't access your data. However, a security lapse in 2022 highlighted that messages were not in fact encrypted - leading to concents around the security of the app and the transparency of the development form.

CYBERBULLYING

Online chats can provide a sense of ananymity, leading some users to post things which they wouldn't normally say in person. Combined with the option of group chats, there's a risk that young people might join in with this kind of behaviour, escalating it further and potentially turning what should be a fun specimen into something desort negative.

Advice for Parents & Educators

JUSTIFY THE CONTROLS

If parents allow their child to use Justials Kids, they should explain that they're putting parental controls in place to make the app saler. Make sure the child knows not to put their full name on the account and doesn't use a photo of thermelves as their puttie picture. This type of open discussion will help to ensure that a child is aware of the app's patential risks and knows how to reduce them.

TALK ABOUT ONLINE FRIENDSHIPS

Young children could be excited to use this app. However, highlight that they must do so in a positive, respectful and responsible manner. While it can be easy to get caught up in a group chat, it's important to talk to others politely and call out any unpleasant behaviour. Discuss the importance of limiting their contacts to people they know in real life and use parental controls to enforce this.

DOS AND DON'TS OF SHARING

Some children might not understand the potential dangers of oversharing online. Set clear guidelines around what is and isn't sale to share on the internet, and discuss the concept of a digital footprint. Children need to understand that the things they say and share online can never be completely erased. Even if they delete it themselves, it can be saved and distributed by others.

ENCOURAGE OPEN COMMUNICATION

Apps like Justalk can sometimes lend themselves to bullying behaviours. Parents should monitor what their child is sending and receiving, check in with them regularly and encourage them to share their feelings (both positive and negative) at home. Remind them that they can block a contact if someone is treating them disrespectfully.
