- Measure items around the house

Spelling at home

Children should continue to practice their Year 3 and 4 spellings orally.

Play a game of "Charades" using the vocabulary

Writing sentences including the words and pointing out when you use the words on a daily basis helps the children retain the words more effectively.

Reading at home

Challenge children to try to find a variety of things to read. Fiction, non-fiction, historical books, scientific trivia, poetry, riddles and so much more. It doesn't even have to be just books, things like descriptions of their favourite games or instructions. Have them read aloud recipes if cooking or baking. Using subtitles when watching a show is also a great way to get them reading!

<u>Science</u>

This half term, the children will be learning about Magnets.

Key Vocabulary: poles, forces, attract, repel

Learning at home ideas:

- Identify uses of magnets
- Take a magnet and explore around the home to see what attracts and repel it
